What NOT to bring: For your safety and the safety of others!

Expensive items
Computers
Guns and ammunition
Skateboards
In-line skates

What to bring:

Personal toiletries
Including soap, tooth brush and tooth paste
Water cup or bottle
Pillow
Towel and wash cloth
Cot or air mattress (cot rental \$5 at camp)
Personal tent (there is plenty of room for personal tents)
Rental Tent (8 tents per campsite are available on prior request only for a \$5.00 rental fee)
Hat to shed rain and sun
Sunscreen/Insect repellent
Swimsuit (warm weather) and extra towel
Pool shoes or water socks to wear in pool
Change of clothes and extra socks and shoes.
Uniform? (determined by pack) usually wear on trip and to supper
Sleeping bag or Sheets (depending on weather)
Pillow
Raincoat
For cold weather: Jacket or coat , Gloves ,Stocking cap ,Extra blankets
Shoes (with enclosed toe) (extra pair if wet weather is expected)
Fishing pole and bait (if you want to) Catch & Release Only , no license required
Bicycle and bike helmet (not for BMX) Ok to ride all over camp but not around building walkways.
Health form (permission to treat)
Medicine
Sense of humor
Flashlight and batteries
Recommend camp chairs of adults for campfire.

Other Useful Information:

1. Camp tents should sleep 2-3 people on cots. Rental Cots \$5.00 each available and can be **paid at camp**, based on first come first served. We have 200 cots on hand.
2. Rental Camp tents are Boy Scout Wall Tent with a concrete floor, 8 available per campsite **upon request 10 days prior** to camping date at a \$5.00 charge for each tent paid with reservation.
3. Restroom/Shower facility between two campsites. Each has at least 5 restrooms and 5 showers. Each restroom has a flush toilet and sink. Showers are individual with hot and cold water. Toilet paper is provided – but not paper towels.
4. Handicap restroom and shower available at each site.
5. Meals are served in air-conditioned/heated Dining Hall. Professional cooks prepare meals. Special dietary needs are handled by prior request in writing to reservationists.
6. At Fort Blue Bell, pellet guns are used. Metal (not paper) targets are used. Guns, targets, safety glasses and ammunition are furnished.
7. Water park / Pool is available year round, each pack allowed time in Water Park weather permitting.
8. Souvenir items and snacks are available at Trader Vic's in Headquarters building.
9. Remember: "Guide to Safe Scouting" does not allow anybody to ride in the open bed of pickup truck.
10. Be aware: There are plants that will sting and prick. (Bull Nettle, poison ivy, Huisache bush, Osage Orange tree, Cat Claw and Mesquite tree)
